To drive from Vancouver to 22361 Stella Road in Fraser Lake, BC, start by getting on Trans-Canada Highway 1 East from downtown Vancouver. Follow Highway 1 for about 57 kilometres until you reach the junction with Highway 97. Merge onto Highway 97 North toward Cache Creek. Continue on Highway 97 for approximately 245 kilometres, enjoying the scenic views along the way.





When you reach Prince George, keep an eye out for the signs directing you to Highway 16 East. Merge onto Highway 16 and drive for about 118 kilometres. As you approach Fraser Lake, take the exit toward Fraser Lake and continue on Fraser Lake Road.

Turn onto Stella Road, and you will find 22361 Stella Road located on your left. Check for weather updates and enjoy the beautiful drive!
