The north end of the property is bordered by a crystal-clear mountain fresh creek which runs year-round. There is already a well, septic, and

power onsite. At the end of the road, you'll enjoy the local peaceful lifestyle and climate while being just minutes from Nakusp and the great fishing on Arrow Lake, natural hot springs, endless yearround recreation and all the services and amenities of this peaceful rural community. This region is known for growing apples and could also be a good grape growing area.
